On 28 July 1928 your father was discharged from the Royal Navy upon completion of his 22 years pensionable service. He entered the Royal Fleet Reserve (RFR) on 29 July 1929, under the service number DEVONPORT A/8706. Members of the RFR maintained their civilian occupations whilst undertaking regular periods of training. On 19 June 1931, your father re-entered the Royal Navy to serve for non continuous service.
