## Another AM for family Stone

JOSEPHINE Stone has been made an AM, the third in her family to receive an Order of Australia award.

Husband Shane Stone, a former chief minister of the Northern Territory, was made a Companion of the Order of Australia (CH) last year.

Mother-in-law Pam Stone, of Albury, received a medal of the order (OAM) several years ago for services to Wodonga, including being the first woman mayor in 1985.

Josephine Stone, 48, a practising lawyer in Darwin, is the daughter of Anna Novak, of Wagga, and her late husband, Miroslav.

She has two children — Madeleine 11, and Jack, 17.

Her parents came to Australia as refugees from the chaos of post-war Europe.

Miroslav Novak fought with the partisans in Yugoslavia.

He arrived at the Bonegilla migrant camp, where he met and married Anna, who had fled Croatia with her family and lived in refugee camps in Europe.

The youngest of five children, Josephine attended Wagga schools and studied law at the Australian National University, marrying fellow law student Shane in 1977.

They studied at Melbourne University, moving to the Northern Territory in 1986, first to Alice Springs and then to Darwin.
