

The first reading

A reading from the Book of Wisdom. The reader is Paul Butler, an old school friend from Wodonga now working as a journalist on the Centralian Advocate. Paul dignified Terry's memory with his national article about his mate.

A virtuous man, though he dies before his time, will find rest. Length of days is not what makes age honourable. nor the number of years the true measure of life. Understanding, this is man's grey hair. Untarnished life, this is ripe old age. He has sought to please God, so God has loved him. As he was living among sinners, he has been taken up. He has been carried off so that evil may not warp his understanding. or treachery seduce his soul. For the fascination with evil throws good things into the shade. And the whirlwind of desire corrupts a simple heart. Coming to perfection in so short a while, has achieved a long life, his soul being pleasing to the Lord, he has taken him quickly from the wickedness around him. Yet people look on uncomprehending, it does not enter their heads that grace and mercy await the chosen of the Lord, and protection, his holy ones. This is the word of the Lord.


The final journey and farwell
