

Dear Resident,

I write to introduce myself as the Australian Labor Party's endorsed candidate for Sadadeen. As your candidate, allow me to tell you a little about myself.

I have lived in Alice Springs since 1980. I'm currently employed as a Journalist. Media is my great interest, and I have from time to time worked for the local ABC as breakfast or drive-time announcer.

Broadcasting has other rewards, especially for a Sadadeen dweller, with the modern facilities of Radio 8-CCC FM just around the corner at the Community College. I have contributed regularly to 8-CCC as a volunteer programmer for the past six years or so, and have served on the station's Programming Advisory Committee since February this year. I'm also on the Board of Directors of the YWCA, the Management Committee of the Bindi Centre, and the Committee of the Alice Springs Sub-branch of the Australian Journalists Association.

As a resident of the area, I have observed with interest, indeed been part of, the rapid growth of the Eastside since coming here seven years ago. Many of the problems facing our area stem from the fact that the physical development of the Eastside has not been matched by the provision of basic social services such as shops, public transport, child care or neighbourhood centres, or even public telephones. I'm sure many of you "on the frontier" in the emerging subdivision of Sadadeen itself have often questioned why such dense population centres as Sadadeen or New Eastside weren't even serviced by a corner store at the time of their establishment. Many years down the track, we're finally seeing some action.

I am personally very interested in matters that affect the overall shape of the town, contributing to public debate on the multi-storey question, and maintaining an active interest in town planning matters generally. As a future Sadadeen representative, I feel it's important to keep abreast of these issues, which are affecting all of us. After the election, I hope to be in a position to do more about them.

Feel free to contact me if you wish to discuss matters further. In any case, I hope to get around to see you as soon as possible. We'll have a chance to talk then.
