LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1958

PROCLAMATION OF THE SHIRE OF WODONGA AS A CITY

HEREAS it is provided by Part II. of the Local Government Act 1958, that the Governor-in-Council may, after the receipt of a petition to proclaim a municipality a city from the council of a municipality which is substantially urban in character and has a population of at least ten thousand inhabitants and which in the year ended on the thirtieth day of September last passed yielded

a revenue from general and extra rates of not less than One Hundred and Sixty Thousand Dollars, proclaim that municipality a city:

AND WHEREAS the Shire of Wodonga is a municipality which is substantially urban in character, has a population of at least ten thousand inhabitants and in the year ended on the thirtieth day of September last passed yielded a revenue from general and extra rates of not less than One Hundred and Sixty Thousand Dollars, and in pursuance of the said Act the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire have presented a petition praying for the exercise of such power:

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and with effect on and from the thirtieth day of March, 1973, hereby proclaim the Shire of Wodonga to be a City under the name of the Rural City of Wodonga.
